7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection

- Tree Plantation was held in the college campus in collaboration with the Environment Society of the college (AVNI) in two phases.
- The first phase of plantation drive was held on 10th September 2015. About 28 NSS volunteers and 14 members of “AVNI” society participated in Pot Painting and Designing Competition” in which the students of the society painted the pots with bright colours and symbols of environment.
- The saplings were planted by the students in these colourful pots.
- The second phase of plantation drive was held on 16th September 2015 in which all NSS volunteers, members of environment society, staff and other employees planted 100 plants in the pots while another 100 were distributed to the students to plant in their backyards or the open spaces near their houses.
